A List of Dominicans in Ireland, 1817

The list or catalogus of Dominicans in Ireland presented here is a type of document which is as useful as it is unusual. At one stroke it provides invaluable data for the local historian and lends a solid statistical basis to the formation of general historical judgments. Comparison of this list with the Netterville catalogus of 1767 (published in the last number of this journal) brings home forcefully the fact that the number of Dominicans in Ireland was halved in fifty years, dropping from 155 in 1767 to 77 in 1817. Every Order in Ireland suffered the same decline: they were unable to receive and train sufficient candidates; many of their members were placed in parishes by the bishops; and (for such as remained in community) life was made impossible by the withholding of faculties and prohibition of the quest.

The 1817 list was written by the provincial, Francis O'Shaughnessy, on the back of a long letter in Latin which he wrote to the Master General from Kilkenny on 17 June 1817. Since both the letter and the list bore on an Irish Dominican dispute then being considered by the Congregation de Propaganda Fide, the General forwarded them to the Congregation, in whose archives they are now to be found. The archival location of the list is APF, CP 152, f. 85r. The list has never been published before: indeed, until a few months ago, it was not known to exist.

It is noticeable that in 1817 a high proportion of the priests of the province bore the name John. Fr Luke Taheny suggests that Fr O'Shaughnessy, like a later provincial in 1832, called his subjects John when ignorant of their proper names. For this reason, whenever there is no doubt of identity, the correct name has been supplied in brackets after "Joannes". The religious names of some other priests have likewise been added or corrected. Another helpful comment has come from Fr Benedict O'Sullivan who noticed the omission of Fr Bartholomew Shine, nominally of the Tralee community, who in 1817 was pastor of Brosna near Castleisland, Co. Kerry. Obviously,

one cannot be certain that the list is complete, nor even that everyone named in it was still alive when it was compiled.
