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Dominicans in Ireland, 1850-1863

INTRODUCTION

Since the Irish Dominicans did not print a list of their own members until 1875, for fear of some penalties still on the statute-books, it is hard to trace the careers of individual friars or study particular communities even for a relatively recent period. As a partial remedy, one may cull the relevant details from the *Irish Catholic Directory* between 1836 and 1874, as has recently been done in a small volume privately printed.¹ However, the *Catholic Directory* was far from complete in its earliest years and never at any time supplied the names of laybrothers or religious students. Much less did it pretend to provide any details beyond the bare names and offices of those it included.

Three occasional lists from Dominican and other archives have already been printed by the present editor. The first, 'A list of Dominicans in Ireland, 1817', appeared in *Collect. Hib.*, ix (1966), 79-82, though unfortunately without biographical notices. The second, 'A list of Dominicans in Ireland, 1832', is in *Collect. Hib.*, xxix (1987), 112-35. The third, 'Dominicans in Ireland, 1841-1845', was printed in *Collect. Hib.*, xxxiii (1991), 178-208. The two latter contributions included biographical notes on all individuals mentioned. In the present case it is better not to attempt biographical notices since the total number of friars mentioned comes to 134. Of these, forty-three have already received biographical notices in this journal, while at least thirty left the Order as students or young priests. Another eighteen lived on into the 20th century. Where available, this elementary information, with the date and place of death, are given in the Index at the close of this article.

Here one has seven new documents; two from the year 1850 and five for the short period between 1860 and 1863. All are rich in biographical detail, but cannot be properly understood without reference to their historical background. The modern reform of the Order began precisely in 1850 with the appointment as master general of Fr

Vincent Jandel. It was to him that the first two documents were addressed, assuring him of the fair name and good work of the friars in their twelve houses and discussing the prospects of a more regular observance, even though few communities had more than two members. At that stage, all candidates for the Order went for their training either to Lisbon or Italy. In 1856, with the purchase of an estate at Tallaght outside Dublin, the first home-novitiate or house of formation of the province came into being. After a few years, the small private house on the estate could no longer house both novices and students. A larger building was required, and of this the first stone was laid by Fr Bernard Goodman, the provincial, only in May 1864. In the meantime, young students were hived off, some to Cork and others to Esker, Co. Galway. Provincial Goodman compiled a '*catalogus*' or directory of the brethren in each of four successive years (1860-63). While largely repetitive, they do allow one to chart the movement of students between the three houses of formation. Goodman also compiled in 1861 a registry of the province (Document 5) which lists the friars by seniority of profession; the document carries his own additional notes up to 1865, and in particular his own list of the 44 novices received between 1856 and 1864. These notes contain details on places of birth and schooling not to be found in any other official record at Tallaght. One may add that the convents of Cork and Esker seem not to have kept any specific record of the students then in their charge.

Mio caro P. White,

In risposta all'enciclica del Rmo. Generale [Vincenzo Jandel] ricevuta il 4 del mese passato, vi prego in qualità di compagno di significare al Rmo. che in questa provincia non abbiamo ne noviziato ne convento di stretta osservanza. I Padri [Guglielmo] Carroll di Limerick, [Eduardo] McCarthy e [Georgio] Wiseman di Drogheda, [Patrizio T.] Conway e [Giovanni] Towers di Dublino si dichiararono pronti di portarsi al convento di osservanza allor quando questo si aprirà. Il P. [Bernardo] Goodman, sottopriore del convento in Dublino anche sarebbe contento, ben inteso sempre che siano dispensati tutti quelli regolamenti i quali non si trovano compatibili colle leggi di questa nazione. Un Padre solo nominatamente Georgio Wiseman ha la volontà di andar alle missioni estere. Egli però è tanto utile e buono per noi che non conviene distaccarlo dalla provincia. Due altri si sono esternati con un qualche desiderio per le missioni, ma in maniera tale che sembra a me che non abbastanza conoscono se stessi. Abbiamo in tutta la provincia dodici conventi, di padri quarantatre soli, ed un converso [Pietro Daly] già assai vecchio. Sette di cotesti conventi hanno solamente due padri per chiascheduno, e da ciò rileverà il Rev.mo Gen.le qualmente sia difficile di mantenervi la disciplina regolare. Il vero si è che generalmente parlando della provincia d'Irlanda, stiamo alle costituzioni dell'ordine esattamente in quelle cose che sono di governo e che appartengono alle elezioni de' superiori, ma del resto ho paura che no ci esista osservanza che basti per distinguerci da preti secolari viventi insieme. La nostra vita non si può dire che sia mortificata di più, o più del loro penitenziale. Ore fisse per l'alzar alla mattina, o per il ritirarci la sera non abbiamo. Ognuno possiede il suo peculio, poco veramente per lo più, ma a parere mio, anche poco che sia, non in tutto compatibile col voto il quale abbiamo preso. L'uffizio divino in chiesa non si dice, fuorché nel convento di Esker, e per quanto io sappia, la messa quotidiana per i benefattori non si celebra conventualmente in nessun luogo. Eppure i padri di questa provincia, bisogna dire, sono morali, esemplari di lavoro, sacrificanti di loro medesimi in quel che concerne la religione Cattolica. E poi sono stati sempre, e tuttora sono di vantaggio incalcolabile ai fedeli. Tanto è vero tutto ciò che sto a riferire, che

nissuno quasi dei conventi anche i più piccoli puossi sopprimere senza recar grandissimo danno e mettere in pericolo moltissime povere anime a motivo della scarsezza dei preti in questo paese.

La mancanza della disciplina regolare è provenuta certamente dalla persecuzione la più fiera forse, e la più dilungata di qualunque altra sostenuta nella chiesa sin dai primi tempi, durante la quale i frati hanno sempre mantenuto nobilmente il primo posto del pericolo. Ma ciò nulla dimeno entra qui l'importante questione se i difetti nostri non si possano semai rimediare se no[n] a qualche punto almeno. Quali rimedi se debbano applicare, e quali le riforme che si debbono introdurre, non mi azzardo di suggerire, ma conforme a quel che ho scritto, e vi ho detto prima della nostra partenza, sono d'avviso che un certo piano di vita comune andrebbe stabilito, e che si dovrebbe imporre l'obbligo a tutti noi di vivere da regolari con sistema tale che sull'esterno si potrebbe scorgere la differenza che passa fra noi e quelli che sono meramente preti secolari. Se il Rmo. Generale verra in queste parti l'anno venturo, sono sicuro che a lui, vedendo le nostre mancanze, sarà facile il formare il piano più opportuno per il desiderato miglioramento delle cose. Ma come ben sapete voi, si sarà bisogno di grande prudenza. A me sembra che quasi tutti goderebbero di vedere la riforma, ancorche così pochi si siano dichiarati per l'osservanza religiosa. A tutti si potrebbe domandare loro sentimenti, ma il Generale potrebbe poi decidere da se stesso e mettere in esecuzione le sue decisioni confermate dall'Autorità Apostolica.

Qui aggiungo i nomi, l'età, l'anno della professione e gli uffizi di tutti i padri di questa provincia. Tutti sono approvati per le confessioni dai Vescovi rispettivi, tolto il P. [Patrizio] Meadth di Kilkenny, al quale le facoltà furono ruscate dal vescovo di Ossoria, non per motivi personali ma perche si è determinato di dar ad uno solo de' nostri il privilegio di ascoltar le confessioni. Riguardo all'[inserzione?] nel calendario dei nomi de nostri fratri, potete voi spiegare al R.mo le legge del registro la quale esiste tuttora contro i regolari.
